
THE LYNN LETTERS





Dear Church Family at Grace Christian Fellowship,

Even on a university campus, with all the distractions from the truth and distortions of the truth, God continues to work in the hearts and minds of this generation. What a privilege we have to come alongside these future leaders, to help them run the race God has marked out for them, and to help them look to Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith.
